The safety training is vital as well as the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to communicate with the operator at all times.

Because of the extreme environments these machines work under, they are often put under incredible strain on a regular basis. This means there are plenty of heavy machinery jobs available for the repair and maintenance of the equipment.
