A Counterbalance forklift refers to a forklift along with a weight which counters the balance, enabling the load's weight to be spread evenly across the arms of the forklift. Counterbalance forklifts are made so the weight behind the center of gravity is counterbalanced by the weight on the lift. The load is projected out from the machine's front so it is visible to the driver of the forklift. This particular kind of forklift truck should only be utilized on level, stable ground or on a prepared surface.

Training is necessary for forklift operators to know the right method to spread the load equally across the arms of the forklift. Trainees will learn how to raise and lower the load vertically and how to tilt the forklift mast both backwards and forwards between 5 and 15 degrees. People training will be taught the RTITB standards needed for safe forklift operation. Individuals training would likewise know the types of attachments for the forklift arms.

Types of Counterbalance Forklifts:

Walkie Pallet Trucks

The counterbalance forklift called the Walkie Pallet Truck is best suited for getting into areas that are both small and cramped. This particular lift is very maneuverable and capable of accessing virtually whatever tight space.

Walkie Stackers

The Walkie Stacker is a different forklift that differs slightly from the Walkie Pallet truck in terms of its lift height. This particular machinery is designed to access tighter spaces and has extra lift capabilities for high stacking. Neither of the Walkie line of lifts could be ridden. The driver has to walk behind them.

Rider Pallet Trucks

Rider Pallet Trucks are made to be ridden. These riding lifts are great for dock unloading and loading.

Wave Work Assist Vehicle

The Wave Work Assist Vehicle is a counterbalance forklift intended to reach great heights of up to 17 feet.

Sit Down Counter Balanced Trucks
